Command Sergeant Major James J. Carabello is the Joint Improvised-Threat Defeat Agency's Senior Enlisted Advisor. Command Sergeant Major Carabello is from North Andover, Massachusetts, and enlisted in the Army in November 1985.

His most recent deployment was as the Brigade Command Sergeant Major of Task Force Spartan, 3d Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division.
